

ISS Operations Brief 21/03/2022

ISS Moldova

(March 2022 - Ongoing)

1. Mapping of refugee children in Moldova, a data base will be elaborated with the support of Eric's Sweden and Plan International. Six social workers and local public administration will work to identify all refugee children especially unaccompanied minors, separated, without ID's etc.

2. Mobile teams: All at risk cases will be referred to the Mobile teams of social workers for case management. This activity will be supported by Plan International and UNHCR.

3. Training for local professionals: Local child protection professionals will be trained on child protection. This activity will be supported by UNHCR and Plan International.

4. Direct assistance: based on identified cases, these families will receive individualized support based on their needs. This activity will be supported by UNHCR (and AVE Copiii will use its emergency appeal funds).



5. A Day care center for children with mothers will be operational at the premises of AVE Copiii and daily 25 children with their mothers will benefit from Ludo therapy as well as individual and group counselling.

6. Outreach activity at the Ukrainian Consulate in Chisinau organized daily by social workers: Information on child protection facility for children and families will be delivered via short informative sessions. Children will also receive food packages. Supported by Caritas Austria and in partnership with the Ukrainian Consulate.

7. Direct support for 300 families at Ungheni districts: All refugees families from Ungheni receive a monthly financial support consisting of 321 Euro per family. The action is supported by Pediatres du Monde (pediatricians of the world) for 3 months.

8. A specialized child protection program is currently in discussion with UNICEF (more information to come).
