

ISS Operations Brief 25/05/2022

1. Continued case management and inclusion of refugee and local children in 7 school districts of Moldova.

Funding from different sources has been secured, but additional funds are still being sought to secure individual support with relief items.

2. A dedicated team of social workers carries out case management for specifically complicated cases across Moldova. Relief items and other support are also needed for both children and adults, to procure medicines, ensure medical treatments as well as payment for kindergarten services and school supplies.

3. The day center is fully operational where mothers and their children can benefit from recreational activities. In addition to those activities for children, ISS Moldova also organizes support groups for mothers.

4. Basic food packages are offered to Ukrainian people queuing for consular services at the Diplomatic Mission of Ukraine.

5. Where possible, ISS Moldova joins the team of the Embassy of Ukraine and completes the humanitarian transports going to localities in Ukraine. If they have resources available, they support maternities with formula for newborns, hygiene and sanitary products for mothers and babies, as well as medications.
